Participants will attend all the workshops to integrate EDI principles and best practices in their course syllabus, materials/modules with solid deliverables by the end of the two-day Summer Institute. All the produced instructional materials will be posted on the district FD website, SI Canvas shell and will be available to share at each campus.

Mid-Fall/end Fall quarter follow up with participants; Winter PD day-Plan a Post-SI workshop at each campus. (Participants will be invited to facilitate a post-SI workshop at each campus with additional stipend.)

Participants: 20 faculty members with 6-7 from each campus will participate in the two-day summer institute. Each will receive \$500 stipend upon active participation and successful completion of the SI. FD SI planning team will use a Lottery system to select the candidates.
